


Summer Newsletter

<u>Outside play</u>

Now the weather is sunnier and warmer we will be playing with water and sand outside every day, so please can you continue to help us by ensuring that your child has



their own named sun hat and that suncream has been applied before coming to Pre-school.

Please also remember spare named clothes, including socks, and wipes in their bag so that we can change them if needed.

Snack time

Thank you so much for bringing in such a great selection of fruit: apples, oranges, pears, bananas, kiwis etc. The children have really enjoyed trying new fruits too. Vegetables e.g. carrots, cucumber

are always welcome too and breadsticks/pitta breads/ crackers remain very popular.

Nuts
